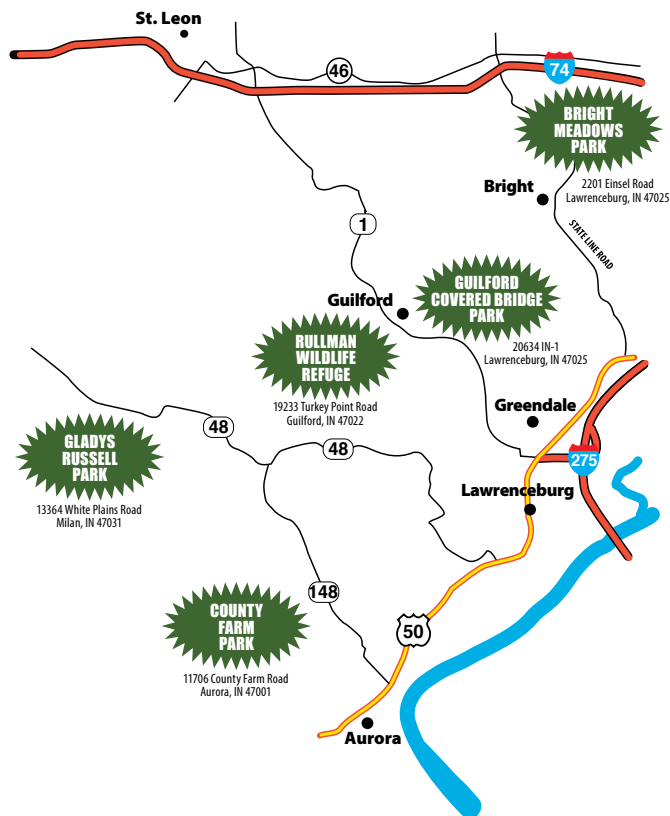

## Bright Meadows Community Park

2201 Einsel Road • Lawrenceburg, IN 47250



At Bright Meadows the focus is definitely on sports. This community park has two baseball fields, a soccer/pee-wee football field, half-court

basketball facility, fitness path, playground, shelter houses and two parking areas.

## County Farm Park

11706 County Farm Road • Aurora, IN 47001



County Farm Park is the largest County park. Native trees and fauna cover a large area bisected by Little Hogan Creek that is an increasingly rare unspoiled natural area. There are

also two ponds and a disc golf course that are open to the public. Public access is limited but future development plans include hiking trails and picnic areas. ## Gladys Russel Wildlife Habitat Area

13364 White Plains Road • Milan, IN 47031

While Gladys Russell is a wildlife preserve with excellent opportunities for bird watching and photography, it also offers a number of low intensity uses including hiking, picnicking, horseback riding, and fishing. Water and sanitary facilities have been added, making activities by

larger groups, such as family reunions and educational field trips, possible. Central to the preserve is a substantial lake that has been stocked with Bass, Catfish and Bluegill. Bird houses and duck boxes are in place to draw nesting pairs.



## Guilford Covered Bridge Park

The oldest park in the system is unique for a number of reasons, Guilford Covered Bridge Park is the site of



the restored Guilford Covered Bridge, a major county landmark and frequent roadside tourist attraction, as

well as an excellent family gathering area with access to Tanners Creek. Cars are permitted to drive through the wrought iron gates, across the bridge and park in the lower lot. A small shelter house, basketball court, play equipment and bathroom are located in the central open space. The park is a popular picnic spot and has been the site for many family reunions and even weddings.

## Rullman Wildlife Refuge

19233 Turkey Point Road • Guilford, IN 47022

The Rullman Wildlife Refuge is dedicated to native wildlife, trees and fauna. The park offers a short walking trail, a new 1.9 mile walking trail, and a "catch and release" fishing pond. We additionally have a shelter and picnic area!
